How Goes it With Your Soul?

John Wesley's admonition to his small groups and Methodist societies was to greet each other with the question, "How goes it with your soul?" His intention was to create a group of believers who not only cared for their own salvation but also were willing to work for the salvation of others. Wesley was strict in his conditions for membership and equally strict in management of the groups. This strict attitude came from what Wesley saw as lax attitudes of the Anglican church, from which Methodism came and the need for the church to reclaim the Holy Spirit in all things.

So how goes it with your soul? Are you where you should be in your faith journey? Do you feel connected to the Holy Spirit? Deep questions, I'll assure you, but necessary for the good of your soul. Remember, it is your relationship with God that provides your salvation and sustains you. This relationship is intended to never be broken.

The fault in our faith journey is our need to be immediately satisfied and our need to trust in tangible things. Some are quick to abandon belief when difficulties cause us to question what we can't see or touch, mainly when we are hurt deeply or when God does not seem to hear our prayers. We are the ones who fail in the relationship.

The good in all of this is God's great attribute of forgiveness and love. God continues to seek us, even when we do not seek God.

The church family must be mindful it has an obligation to support one another in our common journey. Every common believer has a claim upon you. We are the hands and feet of God to each other as well as the world. If you are asking whether I'm saying God holds you responsible for your fellow believer, the answer is yes. Not for another's failures, but for your responsibility to love them back into relationship. We are called to be an active presence in each other's lives, caring and loving. Being an active presence is impossible without occasionally asking, "how goes it with your soul?"
