I have been observing recent events all over the nation following the violence in Charlottesville, North Carolina. I'm sure you have been following as well, as these events have made up the majority of news lately. News sources must report such events; they will not go away by ignoring them. When it is in front of you, it demands your attention.

The change in American attitudes is shocking. The attitude of racism is not new by any means, but it was not nearly as prominent as now People proudly embrace their racism and the activities and visibility of white supremacy groups is at an all time high. This is not nationalism this is hatred. This disgusting trend must be reversed.

America is a nation of many peoples. If you are not Native American by ethnicity, your ancestors came from other nations as immigrants. Others came by force as slaves. It took the Civil War to end slavery and those former slaves became equal citizens as a result of a constitutional amendment. Even later (1941-1945), America entered World War II against Nazi Germany, Fascist Italy, and Imperial Japan, to stop systematic governmental programs of genocide, hatred and racial superiority. Because of faith, America believed in the importance of fighting these evils. Yet today some Americans struggle with the concept.
