Scripture

Our annual stewardship campaign will be held during the first three weeks of this month. The harvest season always revealed to our ancestors how blessed they were as they brought in the fruits of their year's labor. Even when the crops did not produce as abundantly as in other years, they still made certain they expressed their gratitude. The harvest was a time to count blessings.

We carry on this tradition in our celebration of Thanksgiving. As our families gather to share a large meal, we are called to take a look at our year to contemplate the blessings we have received; our health, our families and our material blessings. We look back with gratitude for what God has given to us and then forward with hopeful expectation for the coming year. Even when things have not been as you would want them in the previous year, we are taught to be grateful for what we still have and for any increase, however small.

Our churches have been truly blessed this year. Spiritually, each church added members, including a profession of faith (Hugh!). While we lost some to death, we are still strong and working. Our financial picture is good, bills are

paid, needed repairs made, some new purchases and money left over to begin the year. We are very blessed!

The expression of our gratitude for such blessings is found in our prayers, presence, gifts, service and witness. These expressions are often seen as duties, but they are really a joyous privilege and a blessing.

The measure of our gifts to the work of the church is the return of a tithe, or ten percent, of one's earnings. This is ancient, going all the way back to Abraham. Later, the Israelites were to bring one-tenth of the crops and livestock as an offering. In the New Testament, the measure is not one-tenth, but a gift in keeping with income (1 Cor. 16:2).

I encourage you to tithe your income to the church each year. If you are unable to tithe due to income and obligations, I encourage you to give as close to a tithe as you are able. Perhaps you can step-up one percent each year until you are able to tithe.

As your pastor, I tithe because I am exceptionally grateful for the blessings I enjoy, including both of my churches. Another reason I

tithe is to lead my churches by example. I would find it difficult to ask you to tithe if I did not myself.

On November 18, you will be asked to fill out a pledge card stating your estimate of giving for 2019. The pledge card serves as a tangible way for us to give public testimony to our desire to serve the God. Everyone will be encouraged to bring their card forward at the conclusion of the service. If you are uncomfortable with that expression, you can always return your card to the office at a convenient time.

You will receive periodic statements showing your contributions to date and how they compare with your pledge. Please remember, the pledge card is not a contract. No action will result if you are unable to give as you intended. Also, if your financial situation changes you may revise your card.

I want to express my appreciation for your loving stewardship of the church. Your generosity truly proves a deep love for God and God's people through the ministries of the church. Thank you!
