## Why This? Why Now?

I thought I would take this month's article to explain why I advocate the change in the administrative structure of the church from multiple committees to one committee. This is only my observed opinion and it is offered for the purposes of explanation, and education.

When we set our committees each year we attempt to staff the administrative committee with 9 to 12 members each. Staff-Parish, Finance and Trustees alone would require 36 people. But that isn't the complete story. The chair of trustees and staff-parish, are automatically members of finance by virtue of their offices. This redundancy makes sense in that they are necessary to provide specific knowledge of the needs for those areas.

They also become members of the church council. Someone who agrees to one of these posts must therefore give time to at least three administrative committees to do their job. As each team meets on a Tuesday each month, an entire month is eaten up quickly.

Here are some advantages:

1. These servant/officers will devote their time to one meeting per month (if that is the pattern retained by the council). While each meeting may be longer than historic patterns, it is less in accumulated time than before.
2. The faces are usually the same in small churches. While the Discipline requires that several servant/officers be members of multiple committees, there is always some difficulty in staffing the needed positions from those willing and able to serve causing more duplication. These persons usually experience some "burn out" before they wear out.
3. It will not be necessary to present the same item to three different committees before approval. For example, if trustees desire to change something that requires the expenditure of money, they must debate the item in their own committee to determine a course of action. They must then bring the same item to finance to make certain money is available for the project. Finally, the church council will consid-

er the item. This process may take as little as 2-3 months or much more. The alternative would be to have called meetings in addition to the regular ones.

4. This will offer us more time to do ministry. We spend the bulk of our time just doing the administrative tasks of the church and little time is left for ministry work. I would hope the church could offer more meaningful things such as small groups, educational programs and hands-on mission work. We can be free to be the church.

5. There will continue to be a church treasurer whose duties will not change; the function of that office will be more like that seen in a business setting. The council would review financial reports each month.

6. The council will only handle business items. Each committee/team will provide their minutes to be placed in the record, but there would be no requirement to present oral reports as well.

## Why This? Why Now? (continued)

Here are some concerns and questions you might have.

1. There are fewer people in the decision-making process. While this is true, please remember that many of these are duplicates between the committees.

2. There will be too much power in so few people.

a. In addition to the previous argument, term limits will also require there be a change of committee members each year. People will be appointed to staggered three-year terms, so one-third of the committee may change each year.

b. Whether the council members may serve two consecu-

tive terms must be decided when the structure is established by the charge conference. No one would serve more than 2 terms without a break in service.

3. Who will be the trustees and staff-parish of the church? While the structure may vary some depending on what the charge conference adopts, the council will become the trustees and staff-parish committees. The council will administer those duties.

4. What happens to the rest of the duties in the church? The structure of the ministry teams of the church, such as Christian Education, Mission and Outreach and Nurture, will not change. While each

of these teams will continue to report by providing their meeting minutes to the council, they will coordinate their work through the pastor, who is then ultimately responsible to the council. As the pastor is responsible for the spiritual direction of the church, this is an additional benefit.

I hope this helps you to understand what this plan seeks to do. If you have other comments or concerns, please let me know.
