The events of this year's Holy Week have been great. We tried a new type of worship for our combined Maundy Thursday service and it seems to have been well received. On Easter Sunday, we added two members to the roll at Geyer Springs, saw old friends and met some new people.

We tend to see Easter as one of the bookends of Christ's life and ministry, Christmas being the other. Christmas and Easter fall so close together in the calendar year, which leaves the better part of the year to pass until Advent rolls around again.

Pentecost should be celebrated just as much as Christmas and Easter. It marks the transition of Christ's ministry into a church. Most importantly, it marks the start of a new way of life for Christians. While the law still provides the backbone for our faith, strict adherence to the law is no longer how our faith is measured. Faith is our response to God's gifts of mercy and grace, Jesus' offer of salvation and the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. Faith is about the content of the heart and mind, as well as action.

Pentecost is a reminder of the existence of the Holy Spirit in each of us. When the winds began to blow and tongues of fire appeared on the heads of the apostles that day, everyone present knew something significant was happening. Then the preaching began. While offered in one language, it was heard by everyone there in his or her own language. That was the Holy Spirit, the advocate promised by Jesus, beginning its work in a new wav.

We have the Holy Spirit in each of us. It began as a spark calling you to God's side. Once we have found God's side, what we do with that spark makes all the difference. We can let it burn out now that we have our "ticket" or we can tend the fire and let it burn bright. The bright fire does so much more than that small spark could, providing light to see, cooking, heat for and warmth to chase the cold away.

The success of the church depends on how bright it burns. A spark can be easily missed. A raging fire cannot. The curious from all around come to see the fire. From the curious come those who want to be a part of tending the fire. Remember, the Bible frequently speaks of fire as a refiner, burning off the trash and leaving the pure precious metal for the artist's hand.

TEND THE FIRE! I realize that in the midst of turmoil and pressure both inside and outside the church, it is tough to maintain a bright fire. The time is now and you must do your part. Renew your work in existing ministries. Become a part of a different ministry. Find new ministries. Invite others to church.

Observing Eastertide

Eastertide or the Great Fifty Days, begins on Easter Day and ends 50 days later on Pentecost. We focus on Christ's resurrection and ascension and the sending of the Holy Spirit (Pentecost), Eastertide is the most joyous and celebrative season of the Christian year. We celebrate the good news that in Christ's death and resurrection we, and all creation, are continually being made new by God's love and saving grace. (umc.org)

This extended season gives us time to rejoice and experience what it means when we say Christ is risen. It's the season when we remember our baptisms and how through this sacrament we are, according to the liturgy, "incorporated into Christ's mighty acts of salvation."
